An Album of Painted School Stage Curtains Gillespie County Country Schools Fredericksburg, Texas

Friends Mission: "Preserving the past to enrich the future"

The Historic Country School Painted Stage Curtains of Gillespie County, Texas

Friends of Gillespie County Country Schools was established in 1999 and has been a 501(c)3 group since 2004. They initiated a painted school stage curtain project to document and protect six known surviving stage curtains in 2014. Limited knowledge and the desire to preserve these curtains inspired Friends to treat them as artifacts. These painted drop-roll stage curtains were the least expensive ones made of canvas or muslin and decorated with water-based paint. They commonly had a central scene surrounded by local advertisements. They might last up to 20 years.

In 2015, Friends conserved the Willow City School stage curtain with Anne Zanikos, Art Conservator, and about 60 community volunteers. As a result, friends found additional painted school curtains. In 2018, Friends partnered with Curtains Without Borders of Vermont to survey 13 country school-painted curtains and wrapped and placed three in protective storage. In addition, friends documented 20 Gillespie County painted curtains.

Past students reported "everything happened at the 44 schools": school closings, BBQs, dances, dominoes and card games, calf and goat roping, 4-H clubs, plays, choral singing and music, sewing club, home economics club, the Saengerfest, the Schuetzenfest, polling place, baseball, volleyball, track, and served as a church. All contributed to a sense of community with good neighbors and unity. This album shows the curtains as they are today, not fancy theater curtains but simple curtains for rugged use in schools or halls where school events were held. They are large, colorful historic artifacts telling their story now and tomorrow.

The Friends and the Curtains

The 1847 Vereins Kirche served as the first schoolhouse, and by the 20th century, as many as 44 rural schools operated in Gillespie County, Texas. Families donated land, labor, and materials for rural schools on the land. Of these 44 main buildings, 42 are still standing. The 1949 Gilmer-Aikin Law consolidated most rural schools by 1964, concluding an era of rural schools. School/community clubs began forming in the 1970s to provide school funds and equipment. They continue to operate. Friends of Gillespie County Country Schools was formed in 1999 to initiate a statewide Proposition 13 vote to save country schoolhouses and place them in the care of the County Commissioner's Court. Since 2002, Friends has leased 12 historic schools. Friends continue to provide funding and upkeep, protect school artifacts outside and inside the schools, and preserve our county school history. Unfortunately, the painted school stage curtains were not well documented. Little was known about how they were purchased, how much they cost, who made them, how many existed, or how to preserve these artifacts for the future. The objective of the Friends Curtain Project was to answer some of these questions, thereby learning to conserve and protect our historic school stage curtains. Our research led to a knowledge of how they were used in rural education and rural communities. It produced this album of uncommon Gillespie County-painted school stage curtains.

What Did the Friends Do?

Friends of Gillespie County Country Schools viewed the painted stage curtains as very large country school artifacts after assessment by Art Conservator, Anne Zanikos, in the Fall of 2013. Time to take our "Cinderellas" out of the attics. These architectural artifacts had history almost unknown to us, and a future we wanted to provide. Research said "painted stage curtains were not meant to last". They were less expensive than a fabric stage curtain, quicker to produce with water-based paints on prepared muslin or canvas as a drop-roll curtain, and provided a focus and dramatic door for the stage with a scene that took you to another place. In America, painted stage curtains were produced between 1890 and 1950 by scenic artists/studios for use in opera houses, theaters, town halls, grange halls, and sometimes in country schools. Ads were sold to local businesses to fund the curtains. The community was the audience. The many local newspaper ads for school BBQ's, plays, 4-H club meetings, and annual school closings from the 1930's to the end of the country school era are evidence of community use. The stage was part of rural education and community in Gillespie County, Texas.

Members of the Doss Community Improvement Club found this painted stage curtain stored in the attic and brought out to be mounted with a frame for display in the Community Hall located next to the Doss School. There was damage to the water-based paint, but its overall appearance was good, with much detail intact. In September 2018, the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Partnership Project surveyed this curtain. Having the complete information of the maker and date on the curtain has assisted Friends' study of other painted school curtains in Gillespie County. The Doss School and Doss Community utilize the Community Hall today. Their 1930 curtain is displayed in the school, while their c. 1947-1948 painted stage curtain (included in this album) continues to be used on the Hall stage for school plays and community events. The Doss School is the only Gillespie County country school still functioning as a public school in Gillespie County.

The Luckenbach curtain had been stored in the Engel's Halle/Luckenbach Dance Hall attic for many years. The water-based paints were damaged. The curtain was fragile and prone to tear, making it impossible to mount for a complete photograph. Aerial Photographer, Alex Cortez, volunteered to photograph it to assist with Friends' documentation. Many employees of the town of Luckenbach, Texas, helped the Friends. A matching painted border covers the base of the stage. It appears to have aged but has had over-painted ads. It is unknown if the border was original and part of the curtain border/valance or added later to match the curtain. In September 2018, the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Partnership Project surveyed and wrapped the curtain for safe storage. The Luckenbach School Record Book 1890-1908 stated that rent was paid to Luckenbach Hall for school closings and plays. The book's pages after 1908 are missing.

Luckenbach School Curtain Ads (Pg 1)

Not all ads were legible due to water damage. If an ad was recognized as the same as on other Gillespie County painted stage curtains, it is included as being on this curtain to the best of our ability. Some ads were mostly destroyed and covered with mud from wasp nests. A total of 30 ads are mostly legible.

This appears to be the only painted stage curtain in this study, with several businesses placing more than one ad. For example, City Furniture had three ads, and Knopp Metzger had two ads.

This curtain has been in storage for many years. It hung in the Weinheimer Hall, built in 1936 in Stonewall, Texas. Bernice Weinheimer of Weinheimer Hall assisted in studying this curtain and reported that it was added to the Hall in 1938. She said the Lower South Grape School used its stage and curtain for all their important school events. The only known photos were taken while in use at the Hall. The design of this curtain is consistent with other Dallas Scenic Studio 1930s curtains in Gillespie County. In September 2018, this curtain was surveyed by the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Partnership Project. The curtain was very fragile, with tears and holes. The curtain was wrapped for safe storage during the partnership project.

This curtain was documented in the Wrede School application to the National Register for Historic Places. Former students agree that the curtain most likely dates from the 1930s. The condition of the curtain is fragile due to tears and water damage. The curtain was stored in the school attic for many years. School use included loading the curtain into a grain truck and driving it to the Cain City/Tatsch Hall for Wrede School closing events. Students also reported that the curtain was tied to the porch posts and used for plays and events on their 1896 schoolhouse porch. Former student Jeanette Conn, and daughter Kathy Conn-Saucier, photographed this curtain in three parts to produce their only full photo. This photo is displayed for viewing inside the Wrede School. Attempts to repair and stabilize the curtain are evident. Former students, using safe wrapping techniques, wrapped it for storage. Kansas photographer, Gloria Hawkins, drove 800 miles in 2010 to photograph Wrede and other Gillespie County painted school curtains for her country school collection and to share with Friends.

Friends did not view this curtain since it was stored. All information was taken from photos provided by former Grapetown students. The border/valance portion hanging in Grapetown Schoolhouse was viewed but unable to measure. Former students reported the curtain dates 1935-36, which is locally attributed to J.E. Gordon Studio of Austin, Texas. Julia E. Gordon is known to have traveled to work for Dallas and Waco scenic companies. Perhaps a connection existed between Dallas Scenic, Waco Scenic, and Gordon's Austin Studio in the 1930-1940s. If so, using the same cartouche and design elements in many 1930s painted stage curtains suggested common dates and studios. German words: "Eintracht, Grapetown Schuetzen Verein, and Saenger Verein" on this curtain suggested use by the Grapetown School, the shooting club, the singing club, and the Grapetown Community. Reportedly, this curtain was surveyed by Curtains Without Borders in the past, but no records are available.

Nebo School Curtaín

Nebo School was built in 1927 with a stage room. Their School/Community Pavilion with the stage was built in 1938. From memory in later years, a former student drew floor plans for both and placed a stage in both structures. The pavilion stage would have been larger and more likely to have utilized a 20 ft. x 9 ft. 8 in. painted curtain. Unknown when the curtain was acquired. The design elements are consistent with the Pecan Creek School stage curtain. Pecan Creek Pavilion/Stage was built in 1940, and a former student reported stage was across one corner before the stage was constructed. These two curtains are almost identical in design and ads, possibly between 1927 and 1940. Nebo consolidated with Willow City School in 1950 and moved the curtain with the students. The condition is fragile. This curtain was displayed at Gillespie County Fair in August 2000 to publicize Proposition 13, known as Friends' Bill, to save historic country schools. This Bill passed the Texas Legislature, and voters approved the Texas Constitutional Amendment in 2001. In September 2018, the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Partnership Project surveyed and wrapped the Nebo curtain for safe storage. The curtain remains at Willow City Schoolhouse.

The condition of the Pecan Creek curtain is very fragile, as noted in the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Survey in September 2018. It is recommended that this curtain be wrapped for safe storage as a first conservation step when it is no longer used. Curtain is used on the Pecan Creek School Pavilion's large stage, constructed in 1940, with a lumber cost of \$40. Pecan Creek School painted stage curtain is most like the Nebo School curtain in ad design and overall design elements, suggesting similar dates between 1927-1940. Pecan School/Community Club and Pecan Creek community use and enjoy this pavilion with stage and originally painted school curtain. Their pavilion was built around the early school to protect it and provide an indoor playground or extra classroom space in bad weather. Their archives include stage and play photos.

Pilot Knob School/Klein's Hall/Reeh Hall Curtain

The 1936 Old Teamsters reunion photo is the only known photo of this school/hall-painted stage curtain. The curtain was reportedly lost over the years. Pilot Knob School, as well as Squaw Creek, Morris Ranch, Hayden, and White Oak Schools, used this Hall for some of their large school events. Some have reported that this Hall originally went by Spring Hall, after nearby Spring Creek. The Pilot Knob School history described how they provided a temporary stage at

school: "First, when they had plays, the porch was used as a stage; they would add to it on the north side with lumber. Then, pupils built their stage. They would chop pegs to place boards as benches. They used lanterns for light. They had German plays. School closings were held in Mecklenberg Hermann Sons Hall." After it was torn down, the school closings were held at Klein's Hall/Reeh Hall. This Hall is between Fredericksburg and Harper and is part of El Gallo's Mexican Restaurant site. The Pilot Knob Home Demonstration Club is still active today.

In September 2018, this curtain was surveyed by Friends and Curtains Without Borders. Overall condition is excellent. Only curtain with "go to CHURCH Sunday" ad. This survey suggested a maker consistent with the Twin Sisters Dance Hall curtain signed by Don Owens & Son, Waco, Texas. Since this curtain was locally attributed to J.E. Gordon, additional research was prompted. We learned that J.E. Gordon traveled to Waco and Dallas and associated with scenic companies in both locations. In earlier times, this curtain first hung in Pehl's Hall/ Albert Hall, after being built in 1922, located next door to Williams Creek School, then moved into Williams Creek School's Second Classroom for use by Williams Creek School/Community Club and the Albert Community. Often a country school hung a curtain toward the front of a classroom and cleared this area for programs as a temporary stage. This is how the stage curtain is hung and functions at Williams Creek School. This drop roll curtain is rolled up after use and out of the way. One photo of this curtain used during a 4-H Christmas party has survived.

This curtain was used on the 1936 Cherry Spring School Pavilion Stage until relocated to display on a Pavilion wall between two display cases during the 2017-2018 Pavilion restoration project. The stage was designed initially with movable walls to convert to classrooms as needed. This feature has been altered. Cherry Spring curtain shares the same type of central scene, colors, and ad shapes as Willow City School No. 1 and Doss School No. 2 stage curtains. There is evidence of some ad-over-painting (one ad has red paint drip) on both curtains. Ad phone number research suggested changes most likely completed in 1947. Some former students feel this later date is what they remember. We will continue research to set a date.

This curtain hangs on the Doss Community Hall stage. Two persons must raise and lower the curtain as a team effort, as this is how a drop-roll curtain operates. The central scene of deer, mountain, lake, and trees is the same color and techniques as the Willow City School No. 1 and the Cherry Spring School painted curtains. The wear on this curtain looked the same compared to Willow City No. 1 and Cherry Spring curtains, suggesting these three curtains by the same hand. Some expected damage from continual use by Doss School and the community. Some Doss Community Improvement Club members felt this curtain might have been made 1947-1948 to celebrate the Doss Centennial in 1948. Research on business ads is still active. In September 2018, the curtain was surveyed by the Friends and Curtains Without Borders Partnership Project. This curtain continues to be used for Doss School and Doss Community events.

The Willow City School, built in 1905, is the only Gillespie County two-story school with two lower-level classrooms and a second-floor auditorium with a stage added c.1930s. The auditorium has original handmade German-style wooden benches for the audience. The stage also served as a classroom for high school students. The Willow City 2005 application to the National Register for Historic Places describes the stage and painted stage curtain. School children and adults performed many plays, musical events, and singing programs on this stage, using this curtain. Wear along the edges, tears, holes, and missing pieces are evidence of much use. Friends began conserving this curtain with an assessment by San Antonio art conservator Anne Zanikos in 2013. They were conserved by Anne and a group of about 60 volunteers in February/March 2015. Father-son team, Austin and David Dreyer, of Willow City, Texas, designed and built a bridge with castors, providing workspace for many volunteers. The bridge

allowed six or seven workers to hover about eight inches above the curtain by moving the bridge. Other volunteers worked from the four edges. The bridge disassembles to serve other projects. The WCS No. 1 curtain moved to the lower west classroom for display between two bookcases filled with over 500 original country schoolbooks.

The Willow City School Community Club and Volunteer Fire & Rescue Department conserved and displayed the Willow City School No. 1, produced a newly painted curtain for Willow City School, made upstairs stage repairs, and safely housed the Nebo School curtain. College student Shayna Schaefer Thompson, whose grandfather and father were former Willow City School students, was contracted to design and make this curtain. The 2002 drop-roll curtain is still in use on the WCS stage and in good condition. This curtain has continued the tradition of painted country school stage curtains. In addition, various schools, theater companies, community clubs, and individuals continue to rent the Willow City School to use the stage and auditorium for special events.

What We Learned

The many unanswered questions about the WCS curtains resulted in an inventory of all known Gillespie County country school painted curtains, attempting to answer the fundamental questions of date, maker, cost, and payment. We have documented 19 painted curtains and compared painted curtains in surrounding counties. We learned that the scenic companies sold curtain ads to local businesses, and these ads paid for the school curtain with no documented contribution from the school. Some of our curtains need to be marked or dated. Exceptions are those made between 1930-1939. Ad research noted the date business was established, a name change, a phone number or address match, or when the business closed. For example, Vapo Butane PH 375 in December 1947 changed to PH 272 before the December 1948 phone directory—ad on WCS No. 1 curtain PH 272, dating curtain c.1947. The remaining 21 ads had long histories beginning with Krauskopf Bros, est. 1851, up to Enderlin Feeds, est. 1947. If the curtain was made earlier than business ad research suggested, perhaps ad changes or additions occurred. We did not see much evidence of this. Grouping the curtains by similar designs/colors/ads let us date three curtains without dates. Doss No 1 and Cherry Spring School curtains were almost identical to Willow City School No. 1 in design, color, phone, and ads, c.1947-1948 curtains. Research on dating is still active by Friends.

What We Learned (cont.)

The Friend's initial goal in 2014 to conserve the Willow City School painted stage curtain was the basis for this six-year project. After completing the conservation of the Willow City School painted stage curtain, many questions, without easy answers, continued to come forward. Even at the end of six years of curtain work, we have a new list of questions to drive more research and work. Identifying further questions for future research is positive, although it prevents us from writing an ending today.

We leave you with the hope of learning more. Join us in studying Texas history by inquiring about possible Texas-painted school stage curtains in your town or county. Share what you find. Submit your painted stage curtains to Curtains Without Borders Registry for a national study of painted stage curtains through their Survey Project at www.curtainswithoutborders.org or contact Friends of Gillespie County Country Schools at www.historicschools.org. As this small study demonstrated, comparing additional painted stage curtains added knowledge of scenic studios and their artists and assisted in dating unmarked curtains. Painted school stage curtains are now included on the Curtains Without Borders website.

Gillespie County Country School Closing

While the school closings occurred from April to June in the early years, they consistently presented children and adult plays, BBQ, the traditional "Pruffing", or public oral examination. This was a community event to support the school and celebrate graduation from one class to the next. Some were held in the pastures, and others on the school grounds or nearby hall. Many ads appeared in the local newspaper to invite the public to attend. School closings were held on different dates to allow family and friends to attend as many as possible. The use of make-do stages or the school stage, with a painted curtain, was an essential part of school closings. As many as a thousand people attended, as documented in early photos and school records. School Trustees organized the BBQ fundraisers. The digitized Crabapple School Trustees Record Books include many detailed entries about the school closings and BBQ. Proceeds were used to purchase needed items for the school, such as desks, maps, globes, or play equipment. Schools served the whole community as a meeting place for all. The German cultural heritage continued in the Texas Hill Country by giving land for schools, building the schools, and emphasizing education, plays, music, and singing. When the school funding ran out each year, families paid tuition for each child. Some families worked at school or delivered wood to the school as payment. This explains the school's pride, sense of ownership, and desire to support each event, student, and need.

What the School Stage and Painted Curtain Taught

Plays have served as educational tools since Roman times. Plays are visual but do not require reading. Plays teach literature, history, music, and language arts. The stage is a practical use of what you are learning in school. The teachers and parents often wrote Country School plays, and sometimes students. Plays teach us to respect the many skills needed to present a play.

A play requires:

- organization and planing of jobs;
- learning to work with all ages;
- discipline to follow the script;
- self-reliance taught by finding or making your own props and costumes, using math skills and following directions;
- memorization skills;
- strong public speaking voice, proper skills of elocution with no loudspeakers and no electricity;
- teamwork, taking your turn and partnering to raise and lower the drop-roll curtain--one on each side working in tandem;
- finding a way to provide entertainment for the community when there was little.

Together, they developed confidence and provided practical use for learning.

Gillespie County Country School Stages

Not all painted curtains hung on a stage.

Four essential country school solutions are found here:

- 1. Permanent stage inside schoolhouses at Nebo, Willow City, Morris Ranch, Rocky Hill, Doss, and Palo Alto Schools. These were designated stage rooms or auditoriums and, as needed, served as classrooms.
- 2. Permanent stage in school pavilions at Grapetown, Rheingold, Cherry Spring, Cave Creek, Crabapple, Pecan Creek, and Cherry Mountain Schools. Rheingold School pavilion is described in National Register for Historic Places application: "Pavilion open-air built 1936. 50 ft long by 40 ft wide, a wooden stage at the back of the pavilion with dressing rooms on either side made of 1" X 6" pine boards, the floor is cement, the ceiling is open, the roof is tin, no other walls, and eight wooden posts, four on either side to support it."
- 3. Permanent stage in school pavilions at Grapetown, Rheingold, Cherry Spring, Cave Creek, Crabapple, Pecan Creek, and Cherry Mountain Schools. Rheingold School pavilion is described in National Register for Historic Places application: "Pavilion open-air built 1936. 50 ft long by 40 ft wide, a wooden stage at the back of the pavilion with dressing rooms on either side made of 1" X 6" pine boards, the floor is cement, the ceiling is open, the roof is tin, no other walls, and eight wooden posts, four on either side to support it."
- 4. Arbors with cedar post frames and fresh branches were used to protect from the sun to create a stage-like area. Wolf Creek and Crabapple Schools are examples. Wolf Creek School archives include a photo of their Arbor used at School Closing.


Questions for Further Study

- 9. Could Friends partner with Gillespie County Historical Society to establish a Photo Collection of Gillespie County Painted Stage Curtains with school and hall-painted curtains?
